PUBLIC NOTICE

I-515/Charleston Boulevard Interchange Public Information Meeting September 22 in Las Vegas

WHAT: The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), invites the public to an informational meeting to solicit input for the I-515/Charleston Boulevard interchange project in Las Vegas. Proposed improvements include auxiliary lanes on I-515 between the Eastern Avenue and Charleston Boulevard interchanges, reconstructing the Charleston Boulevard interchange, and widening Charleston Boulevard east of the I-515 interchange.

WHY: The purpose of the proposed improvements is to increase safety and improve traffic operations for both current and future traffic needs for better mobility.

WHEN: Thursday, September 22, 2016, 4 p.m. – 7 p.m., with a presentation at 5:30 p.m.

WHERE: East Las Vegas Community Center, Ballroom, Las Vegas, NV. 250 N Eastern Avenue, Las Vegas.

WHY: Increased travel and rapid development along Charleston Boulevard has facilitated the need for safety enhancements for improved pedestrian mobility and greater travel reliability without incident.

WHO: The public is encouraged to attend. Comments may be submitted for the public record in writing at the meeting or verbally to a court reporter who will be present at the meeting. Written or emailed comments will be accepted through 5 p.m., October 7, 2016.
