105.6.2 Amusement buildings. An operational permit is required to operate a special amusement building.

Justification

IFC base code language already has provisions regarding time limitations on permits issued. Section 105.3.2 of the IFC allows the permittee to apply for extension of time on issued permits and grants the fire code official the authority to grant extension of time on issued permits. The added verbiage to section 105.3.1 of the Southern Nevada Fire Code amendment only provides clarification to existing provisions and is duplicative in nature. Repealing this amendment to the code would reduce the amount of amendments to the currently adopted code and correlate with provisions of national model codes.

Adding language from the 2015 IFC further clarifies the added item(Liquefied carbon dioxide) in the amended Table 105.6.8 of the Southern Nevada Fire Code for permissible amounts.

2. For emergency repair work performed on an emergency basis, application for permit shall be made within two working days of commencement of work.

Justification

The additional language added clarification to include construction permits to medical gas systems. The existing language in section 105.7.3 already states requirements for construction permits when dealing with compressed gases. Eliminating the additional language is needed to eliminate duplicative provisions in different codes and the resultant potential for future code conflicts.

Table 105.6.8 and Table 105.6.10 deal with compressed gases and cryogenic fluids. Sections 105.7.3 and 105.7.4 have provisions regarding permit requirements for compressed gases and cryogenic fluids. The added language was to clarify what was already existing within the base code language and can be removed without detriment to the intent of the code section.

307.4 Location. The location for open burning shall not be less than 50 feet (15 240 mm) from any structure, and provisions shall be made to prevent the fire from spreading to within 50 feet (15 240mm) of any structure.

Exceptions:

1. Fires in approved containers that are not less than 15 feet (4572 mm) from a structure.
2. The minimum required distance from a structure shall be 25 feet (7620 mm) where the pile size is the 3 feet (914 mm) or less in diameter and 2 feet (610 mm) or less in height.

## Justification

Construction requirements for LPG or natural gas fuels in one and two family dwellings are governed by the IRC and require a permit from the building code official. Permitting for one and two family dwellings falls under the authority of the building code official and eliminating the added exception is not required and would eliminate duplicative provisions in different codes and the resultant potential for future code conflicts.
