➔ PUBLIC ART

The city of Las Vegas Arts Commission (the city's public art agency), is administered through the Office of Cultural Affairs. Created by city ordinance in 1987, the Arts Commission is comprised of a 12-member board appointed by the Mayor and City Council. The Arts Commission funds public art projects through the city's one percent for the arts program and oversees the commissioning of all artwork located on city property.

More than 40 works of art have been commissioned through the Arts Commission's Art In Public Places program.
