

Film/Right of Way Event Permit Frequently Asked Questions

1. Does the city of Las Vegas always require insurance?

Yes, insurance is required. The city of Las Vegas requires an insurance endorsement that names the following entities as an 'additional insured':

Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (METRO)
400 Stewart Ave
Las Vegas, NV 89101

Insurance Requirements

- ✓ General Liability \$1M per occurrence/\$2M Aggregate with a Waiver of Subrogation
 - ✓ Automobile Liability \$1M Combined Single Limit with a Waiver of Subrogation
 - ✓ Employers Liability \$1M with Waiver of Subrogation
2. Where do I submit the permit?

3. How much time is needed to process a permit?
Film Permit requires 5 working days with no road closures.
Film Permit requires 14 working days with road disruptions.
Parade R-O-W Permits require 60 days.
All other R-O-W Permits require 14 working days.

5. METRO Support
Lane/road/alley closures and Intermittent Traffic Control (ITC) requests will require staffing by Metro officers – please contact them immediately at 702-828-3442 to make them aware of your planned event. Metro requires 14 calendar days advance notice to staff events.

6. Fremont Street Experience (FSE)
FSE, located in downtown Las Vegas on Fremont St between Main St and Las Vegas Blvd, requires a city of Las Vegas Film Permit and a separate Location Agreement from the Fremont Street Experience LLC. Contact the coordinator at contact@vegasexperience.com or Phone 702-676-5600.
